

Lesson Plan

Chapter 1

Covenant Keepers Grade 7 & 8 Prophecies Are Fulfilled

Objective

By the end of this lesson, students will

- Understand the importance of Old Testament prophecies about the Messiah.
- Recognize how these prophecies were fulfilled in the birth and life of Jesus.
- Appreciate God's plan for salvation revealed through the prophets.
- Reflect on how faith in Jesus is rooted in these fulfilled promises.

Introduction

Opening Prayer:

Begin with a prayer asking the Holy Spirit for guidance and understanding.

Introduction

Ask students: "Have you ever waited for a promise to be fulfilled?"

Link this to how the people of Israel waited for the promised Messiah.

Briefly introduce the concept of prophecies in the Old Testament.

Presentation of the Topic

Bible & Textbook Exploration

- Ask any one of students to narrate the story of Christmas.
- •. Read key prophecies from the Old Testament (e.g., Isaiah 7:14, Micah 5:2).
- Compare them with their New Testament fulfillment (e.g., Matthew 1:22-23, Luke 2:4-7).
- Use a matching activity: Prophecy on one side, Fulfillment on the other.

Discussion

Ask:-

- Why is it important that Jesus fulfilled these prophecies?
- What does this tell us about God's faithfulness?
- How do these fulfilled promises strengthen our faith today?

let students come up with their understanding with the help of the above questions.

Habit Formation

- 1. Students should trust in God's promises.
- 2. Fulfill the promises that you have made to God and to others.

Activity

Choose any one of the following:

- Matching Game: Match OT prophecies with NT fulfillments.
- Role Play: Enact a short scene of a prophet announcing a prophecy.
- Quiz/Bible Drill: Who can find the matching New Testament verse first?

Bible Verse

Luke 1:38

Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.

Conclusion

Jesus is the promised Savior foretold by the prophets.
