

The Word of God and Christian Life

Objective

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- Understand the importance and power of the Word of God in Christian life.
- Recognize how the Word of God leads to conversion, holiness, and eternal life.
- Develop a habit of listening to, reading, and living according to the Word.
- Express their personal relationship with the Word creatively and practically.

Introduction

"Bible Verse in a Box" Activity

Materials: A transparent jar/box/ bottle labeled 'WORD OF LIFE' with slips of paper containing Bible verse.

Steps:

- 1. In the class, hand each student a small slip of paper with an inspirational Bible phrase (e.g., "You are the light of the world," "Fear not, I am with you," etc.).
- 2. Ask them to silently read it and write one word about what they felt after reading it (e.g., peace, hope, strength).
- 3. Collect all the slips in the "Word of Life" bottle.

- 4. Tell them Just as each of your slips holds a word that inspired you, the Word of God fills our life with light, peace, and direction. Today, we will discover how.
- → This builds curiosity and emotional connection right from the start.

Presentation of the Topic

Use storytelling + visuals + group discussion to bring out the main ideas.

Let the children recite these 3 statements:

- 1. The Word converts.
- 2. The Word sanctifies.
- 3. The Word gives life.

Part .	A: The Power of the Word (Story-based)
O 1	Fell the story of Zacchaeus (Lk. 19:1–10) — how hearing Jesus' words changed his life.
A	Ask: What made Zacchaeus change instantly? Can a few words really transform someone?
Part B: The Word Gives Life	
_	Explain that God's Word gives spiritual, emotional, and even physical strength — just as Jesus' word raised Lazarus and healed the sick.
Part C: Living the Word	
_	Ask groups of students to discuss real-life examples of each (from saints, Bible stories, or heir own experiences), How did they live the word of God?
C	aluda. Vaa baanua tha Wand of Cad annia tha naway of Cad Linealf

Conclude: Yes, because the Word of God carries the power of God Himself

They then share in one line: "The Word of God can..." (e.g., "The Word of God can change anger into peace.")

Habit Formation

Encourage students to form a "Word of God Moment" each day.

Every morning, I will read one Bible verse and ask, "What is God telling me today?"

Activity

Let the children write their favourite 5 Bible verse in their notebook.

Bible Verse

Read and Learn

The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. — John 6:63

Conclusion

End with a short prayer:

O Jesus, Your words are spirit and life. Let Your Word light my path, purify my heart, and strengthen me to live according to Your will. Amen.
